They are learning how to use scissors and glue properly, learning letter sounds including the short vowel sounds, counting by 1's, 5's and 10's, recognizing patterns, saying the months of the year and days of the week in order, and telling time by the hour and half hour. Most importantly, they are trying to remember to use their good manners and be kind to their friends especially during play time when they are sharing toys. They are also continuing to work on their listening skills when given oral instructions.

This week we learned the letters "L" through "O". We learned fun facts about lions, monkeys, newts, and octopus. We also learned the short vowel sound of "O". We continue to increase our oral vocabulary everyday by using the words that begin with the letter sound of the day in sentences.
